Secondary Major Requirements

(30 credits required)

International Experience	An internship or study abroad experience in international agriculture, an exchange program OR a foreign language, OR any combination of these options that equals 6 credits	6 credits or best combination
Required Coursework	Agron 342: World Food Issues	3 credits
Selected Coursework in International Agriculture	Select 6 credits of international agriculture courses from any of the College of Agriculture's departments**	6 credits or best combination
